Captain's Introduction

The Men's Blues cricket team had one of their most successful and enjoyable seasons in recent memory. In BUCS cricket, Oxford University Cricket Club (OUCC) topped the BUCS South Premier league, leading to a national semi-final against Loughborough University and a promotion match against Solent University. In a thrilling match, Oxford recovered from 61-6 to chase down 216 against Loughborough, to reach the National Final at Kibworth CC against Cardiff. Despite a brilliant century from George Roberts, Oxford fell just 10 runs short of Cardiff's 258-5. However, a strong team performance in the promotion match against Solent led to victory, earning the Men's Blues promotion to the National Universities BUCS league, where they will compete among the top 8 university teams.

In Varsity cricket, Oxford sought to improve on past results. At Lord's, Oxford chased down Cambridge's total of 156, with Josh Royan hitting the winning runs after the bowlers restricted Cambridge. The 50-over match was the season's highlight, with Oxford defending a total of 263. Despite Cambridge's partnerships threatening to chase down the total, Oxford's bowlers took 4 wickets in as many overs for a thrilling finish. Vignesh Venkateswaran held his nerve in the final over, securing the win.

In the 4-day match, Oxford dominated by posting 446-6 dec. against Cambridge's 222, with 90s from Vivek Narayan and Josh Royan, and Toby Brown's maiden OUCC century. With rain expected on day 4, our bowlers wrapped up victory by an innings and 6 runs inside 3 days, with next season's captain Justin Clarke taking a five-wicket haul, his first for the club.

This remarkable season for the Men's Blues was made possible by our coaches Graham Charlesworth and David Ward, scorer Mark Williams, the ground staff, and the senior committee. We thank them all enormously for their support and commitment to the club! The OUCC Women's team enjoyed a successful and rewarding season, winning 10 out of 12 games, with impressive performances and significant progress both on and off the field. Featuring talented players from the University of Oxford and Oxford Brookes, the team displayed both skills and determination, whilst competing at club, county, and representative levels.

In our BUCS league, we finished second in our division and showcased our ability to compete against top-tier teams. The season was filled with memorable moments, including hard-fought victories and close games which could have gone either way. Our competitive spirit and teamwork were evident in key fixtures, where the squad consistently delivered strong performances and adapted well to different challenges.

The pinnacle of the season was the annual Varsity match against Cambridge, a highlight that lived up to its reputation for fierce rivalry and high stakes. We set a modest target but delivered a dominant bowling performance to secure a 53-run victory.

Beyond the pitch, we have been committed to promoting women's cricket within and outside the university. We ran multiple beginner sessions at the Parks, aiming to make the sport more accessible and increase participation from women of all skill levels. This effort reflects our dedication to fostering an inclusive and supportive cricket environment, to expand the sport at university and college levels.

Reflecting on the season, I can say that captaining the team has been a personal highlight. Leading such a talented and committed group of players was immensely rewarding, and it was a unique opportunity to contribute to the team's success and development. As our season comes to a close, the

Women's Blues can be proud of our achievements and I am excited to build on this year's successes in the seasons to come.

Men's South Africa Tour

The OUCC Men's Blues squad returned from tour to Cape Town. The 15-strong squad was led by captain Ben Swanson and Tour Manager William Frewen. The tour began with a trip to Seal Island followed by an afternoon T20 victory against Green Point CC, courtesy of Saglain Choudhary's 4-14 and 35 with the bat. Our second game was against the social side Groot Drakenstein CC, one of the most stunning locations (pictured) many of the touring party have played at. OUCC racked up a massive 343 off our 50 overs, with Robbie Hardwick 100*, Max Kirkby agonisingly dismissed on debut for 99 and Toby Brown 94*. Despite the customary glass of brandy before going out to field, we managed to restrict Groot Drakenstein to 175 all out with wickets shared between the bowlers



Despite playing 6 games in 9 days, we were also able to enjoy the sights and culture Cape Town has to offer. Particular highlights include the cable carassisted ascent of Table Mountain, and visiting vineyards in the Stellenbosch and Franschhoek regions (and still being able to play the day after!).

Whilst we were lucky enough to have some success on the pitch this tour, winning 5 of 6 games, perhaps the biggest gain to the team from the tour is bringing the Men's Blues squad closer together as a group through time spent off the field.





Our only defeat of the tour came against Western Province CC under the gaze of Table Mountain (pictured). Despite recovering from 8-2 to reach 284 (Toby Brown 64, Robbie Hardwick 59, Justin Clarke 40* off 15), WPCC chased the total in the final over courtesy of 145 from first-class batter Gavin Kaplan. The Men's Blues recovered strongly the following day in a T20 against Claremont CC, restricting the opposition to 144 before chasing the total with 8 wickets to spare thanks to an Alec Kenningham 50*.

In our final 2 games we beat Maties CC and Brackenfell CC in two low-scoring games, defined by accurate spin-bowling from Ben Swanson (5-14 & 4-32) and Saqlain Choudhary (4-9). Some gutsy batting performances across the team helped to grind out respectable scores in challenging conditions in these 2 matches.







Lord's T20 Varsity







OUCC Men's and Women's Blues played their T20 Varsity Matches against Cambridge at Lord's. The Women's Blues played in the first of the T20 doubleheader, electing to bowl first.

Despite 4 wickets from Hannah Sutton, Cambridge were able to get to a formidable total of 163, courtesy of strong batting performances by Routledge & Boaden.

In reply, the Women's Blues unfortunately fell short by 36 runs, despite contributions from Hannah Davis, Ellie Micklewright and Annys Thirkell-Jones at the top of the order.













Lord's T20 Varsity

In the second T20 of the day, OUCC won the toss again, with Ben Swanson electing to bowl first. Cambridge got off to a the quick start in Powerplay, with Houillon scoring 49 before being run out by a super piece of fielding from fresher Dhruv Talati.

Wickets were shared amongst the bowlers, with spinners Ben Swanson, Chris Mingard and Vignesh Venkateswaran slowing Cambridge down in the middle overs. Cambridge reached a respectable 156-7 off their 20 overs.

OUCC opening batter George Roberts set about chasing this total with a superb innings of 79, ably supported by cameos from Justin Clarke and Max Kirkby through the middle.

With 1 run to win, it was left to Josh Royan, in his final year at Oxford, to win the game by carving one away to the offside boundary – bringing back memories of Ben Stokes at Headingley in 2019.

Authentics T20 Varsity Report

BUCS - Women's Blues

The Women's Blues have had a relatively successful BUCS campaign in the Midlands 1A group with notable performances against Nottingham and Cambridge.

The season began in earnest with an away day against Loughborough 2's after Lincoln conceded their match on the 24th of April. Hannah Davis won the toss and elected to put L'boro into bat and open the bowling with Rosy Wilson and Evie Mayhew. Success fullowed with 3 wickets for Charlotte Maple until the opposition were 67 runs all out. The Women's Blues chased this down in 13.4 overs with a 32* from Chloe Westbury at the top order.

The next match would be at the Parks against Warwick. OUCC batted first and totalled 191/5 after the full 30 overs with a masterful 110* from the captain Hannah Davis. A five-wicket haul from Maya Barnwell led to the Warwick 64 all out in 27 overs.



A top of the table clash would follow against Louborough 1s on the 29th of May would prove to be the most challenging BUCS match of the season. Oxford elected to field first. However, the low total would prove difficult against a strong Loughborough bowling attack. At 55-6, the situation looked tense but quick lower order partnerships raised the total to 98-8. Eventually, the Women's Blues fell short by 1 run in the final over in a tough loss. Whilst low in runs, it proved to be an incredibly tense match with good performances from both sides



In short succession, the Women's Blues would have to bounce back against a rescheduled Nottingham Ladies 1st XI the following Friday. The game was rain effected and a delayed start with a 25 over game commencing at 14:00. OUCC fielded first again with Nottingham setting a 105 target. However, the Blues chased this down in 25 overs with a similarly nailbiting finish!

The final BUCS match was at Jesus College, Cambridge. OUCC batted first with another key innings from skipper Hannah Davis and a notable 180 SR cameo from Ella Austin to reach 138 total. With no wide lines in sight, the Women's Blues dried up the Tabs over 30 overs till they were 97/7. A strong win and a sign of good things to come!

The Women's finished second in their division behind Loughborough after a strong performance across a highly successful season.







BUCS - Authentics

The Authentics had a very strong start to their BUCS campaign this year. Playing an exceptionally strong Oxford Brookes side at home, Jack Cobb lost the toss and the Authentics were asked to field first. A quick opening spell from Will Marriage (3-31) ran through the Brookes top order. This was followed up well through the middle by Jack Cobb (3-41) and Vivek Narayan (2-41), to limit Brookes to 210 all out off their 50 overs. In reply, the Authentics lost early wickets, bringing Cobb and Narayan to the crease. In the face of high quality bowling, these two batters put on a 100+ partnership before Cobb fell for 48. This just left Musa Ali (14*) and Narayan (74*) to finish the job and secure a very satisfying win against our neighbours.

Unfortunately, this was the sole highlight of the Authentics BUCS campaign. The remainder of the season was blighted by rain and rearranged fixtures coinciding with exams. The Authentics missed an opportunity to record another victory, as the match against Nottingham Trent was abandoned due to the weather. Despite battling hard in other fixtures, the Authentics were defeated by strong Nottingham, Warwick and Worcester sides. Sadly, these results saw the Authentics relegated from Midlands Tier 2A. Next year we hope to rebuild and seek promotion back to this league - whilst also beating the Cambridge Crusaders in the league fixture next year!









BUCS - Men's Blues



The Men's Blues had a very successful BUCS campaign this year in their Premier South Group. We began the league season against Bristol in April. Chris Mingard (4-24) and Josh Royan (2-11) bowled very well to rattle through the Bristol batting line-up leaving the opposition 121 all out. George Roberts made light work of this with an excellent 81* (a sign of things to come!) to win by 7 wickets.

Our second game away at Bournemouth saw a similarly comprehensive victory, with captain Ben Swanson taking 5-31 on a damp pitch to bowl Bournemouth out for 102. Dhruv Talati scored a quickfire 59* to see the Blues to a comfortable 9-wicket victory.

We continued our campaign against Exeter 2nd team back at the Parks in May. An excellent opening spell from Josh Royan was backed up through the middle overs by Chris Mingard and Usama Salamat to bowl Exeter out for 206. In reply, Saqlain Choudhary scored a blistering fifty to put OUCC in place to narrowly get over the line by 2 wickets. After our game against University of Cardiff was cancelled, we played Reading in a very important game for our chances of promotion. In a rain-affected game, our innings was reduced to 30 overs. Unfortunately, we could only muster 130-8, which was comfortably chased down by Reading within 25 overs.

This left our final group game against Cardiff Metropolitan the following day. An excellent opening spell by Justin Clarke (3-32) reduced a Cardiff Met side consisting of several UCCE players to 31-3. Spin twins Ben Swanson and Chris Mingard continued this good work with figures of (2-14) and (3-21) respectively, to bowl Cardiff Met out for 98.

In response, the Blues decided to make it very difficult in the chase. At 63-6 the result was in doubt, however, Ben Swanson and Toby Brown steered the side over the line to a 3 wicket victory.Victory in this game saw the Men's Blues top the BUCS Premier South group, resulting in a National Trophy semi-final against Lougborough and a promotion play-off vs Solent.







BUCS - Men's Blues

In our first National Trophy semi-final for many years, we played Loughborough Men's 1st team at the Parks. Josh Royan (2-20) set the tone early, followed up by a strong spin bowling performances by Saqlain Choudhary (3-44) and Ben Swanson (3-10) bowled Loughborough out for 209 in less than 40 overs when they were on course for a large total.

In reply, OUCC faltered to 61-6 against some impressive Loughborough bowling. Rearguard action from Justin Clarke (37) and Toby Brown (58) clawed Oxford back to 138-7. Ben Swanson then came in and played a captain's innings to score 45* before Vignesh Venkateswaran sealed a 2 wicket victory, as seen below.



Victory in the National Trophy semi-final saw us into the final held at Kibworth. Bowling first on a flat track, OUCC's Chris Mingard (1-35) and Max Kirkby (1-45) bowled tightly to restrict Cardiff University to 258-5 off their 50 overs.

In reply, George Roberts lead the charge with another fantastic knock. Compiling a brilliant 120, Roberts was well-supported by Vivek Narayan (36). The Men's Blues were in a strong position at 210-3. However, an unfortunate batting collapse to 248 all out left the Blues an agonising 10 runs short of victory.

Nonetheless, this represented a fantastic BUCS cup run for OUCC and contributed significantly to one of the most memorable seasons in recent years.



Looking to avenge our defeat in the National Trophy Final, the Blues played Solent in a play-off match with promotion to the BUCS Premier League on the line. Batting first on the south coast, OUCC scored 231-9 off their 50 overs thanks to 83 by Toby Brown. Defending this total, Chris Mingard again made inroads with his 2-30 alongside Justin Clarke (3-35). Solent were reduced to 145-7 before a battling innings from their number 8 left them needing 26 to win with 1 wicket left. Vignesh Venkateswaran again demonstrated his nerve to bowl a wicket maiden and clinch promotion. Promotion represents a massive step for OUCC, returning to the highest level of university cricket in the UK.



As can be seen in the images with this report, many of our BUCS games this year have been live-streamed. We are looking to continue this provision in future years and are looking at various options to facilitate this.







Arundel Weekend

Friday - Authentics

OUCC hosted its 3 x 50 over Varsity matches against Cambridge at the picturesque Arundel Castle Cricket Ground. The Authentics played first on Friday 21st against the Crusaders, who elected to bat first. The Authentics put in an excellent combined bowling and fielding performance, led by a three-pronged pace attack of Chris Carnegie (2-34), William Marriage (2-37) and Max Kirkby (2-30). The Crusaders finished on 212-8 after their 50 overs, which seemed a worrying total when the Authentics were reduced to 13-2. Batting at 3, Max Kirkby was able to carry his side home with a brilliant 86*, well supported by Tom Munns (37*) to bring the Authentics to a 4-wicket win to avenge their defeat in the T20 Varsity.

Arundel Weekend

In defense of this total Oxford started with a combination of Hannah Davis and Poppy Sutcliffe. Both bowlers ran through the Cambridge batting line-up, removing dangerous players Routledge and Boaden. Hannah Davis finished with incredible figures of 10-6-7-5, with Poppy Sutcliffe taking 4-21. It was, however, Ella Gallagher who finished the game off by trapping Cambridge's number 9 batter LBW. The Women's Blues won the match by 53 runs in the end, a very impressive effort to defend such a low total.





Sunday - Men's Blues

After the previous 2 results, the pressure was on the Men's Blues to make it 3 from 3 at Arundel on Sunday. Ben Swanson chose to bat first, with George Roberts anchoring the innings at the top of the order, scoring 97*. Cameos from Josh Royan, Robbie Harwick and Vignesh Venkateswaran were enough to see the Men's Blues to a strong total of 263-9 after 50 overs. In response, Cambridge were reduced to 35-2 by a quick opening spell from Justin Clarke.

However, the Cambridge batters worked their way back into the game and looked on top at the 2nd drinks break after 34 overs. Returning spells from Ben Swanson (3-42) and Justin Clarke (3-47) turned the game in Oxford's favour, before a last wicket partnership left the Tabs needing 7 to win from the final over. Vignesh Venkateswaran kept his cool and left Cambridge's number 11 requiring 3 to win off the final ball. Fortunately, a miscued sweep shot only resulted in one run and Oxford Men's Blues recorded a memorable 1 run victory.

The University Match

OUCC Men's Blues played Cambridge in the 180th University Match last week. On a green pitch, Cambridge won the toss and batted - motoring along to 103 runs without loss. However, a brilliant spell by Chris Mingard (19-9-29-4) was ably supported by Vignesh Venkateswaran (21-7-51-2) to reduce Cambridge to 200-8.

Saqlain Choudhary picked up the final two wickets to bowl Cambridge out for 222 just after tea on the first day's play. George Roberts and Max Kirkby skilfully negotiated the new ball to be 53-0 overnight.



Unfortunately Kirkby fell just after the start of the 2nd day's play, leaving Roberts and Vivek Narayan on Blues debut to build the innings. Roberts made 61 before falling to the off-spin of Samir Sardana. This brought Josh Royan to the crease with Narayan, where both piled on the runs in quick time to make a partnership of 113 to leave the score 243-2.

Cruelly, both Narayan and Royan were out for 92 - missing out on very well deserved centuries. Toby Brown and Saqlain Choudhary then looked to push the pace on to force a declaration. Brown scored his first Varsity century with 104*, while Choudhary recorded a quick-fire 40. This set up captain Ben Swanson with a chance to declare at 446-6, a lead of 224 and leaving over a day and a half to bowl Cambridge out.



On the 3rd morning, the task of bowling Cambridge out was taken on by incoming captain Justin Clarke, who bowled a masterful spell to remove Cambridge's opener and number 3 in the space of two balls. Mingard, Clarke and Swanson chipped in with wickets through the middle of the innings to leave Cambridge 7 down.

Cambridge rallied thanks to a great innings from Aaran Amin (92), but Saqlain Choudhary removed the danger man. This left Justin Clarke to take the final wicket of the innings to complete a brilliant 5-wicket haul and seal victory by an innings and 6 runs.

George has been OUCC's standout player this year, delivering when it mattered most - right throughout the season. George studies French & German at St Peter's and is in his second year at University. George came to University having spent time in the Surrey academy pathway and representing his region at the Bunbury festival.
